4. The Fish Migration Ecolabel works like a traffic light for migrating fish

The fish migration ecolabel serves for more transparency in the quality assessment of migration facilities for fishes around obstacles in rivers. According to traffic light system from "green" to "red" for "free ride" until here "it does not work" is to be represented for the fish migration. Furthermore, and this is still far too rare, distinguished by fish ascent and fish descent. So far we have created for the Rhine, the lower Isar, the area Aller, Oker, Weser and the united Mulde the fish migration ecolabel for river sections. The presentation can be found [here](#).
